It was fantastic to finally get the last 'piece of the puzzle' in the form of the Tumble Strip extension fitted mid-year. We are always looking to improve the experience for our gymnasts & coaches, so the committee is now looking at sourcing spotting platforms around the gym.

We have updated the Omni logo this year. It's a fresh, new look that represents who we are & what we do – we're on the move and all inclusive, you'll see this detailed in the reports from our team.

As a 'Not For Profit' organisation Omni relies on it's community to keep it going. Yes, we have paid staff, however they are paid as our coaches. We still need the whole community to help out — with working bees, setting up & packing up for competitions, fundraising, scoring & recording, canteens, raffles — there are many ways, large & small, to be involved in your club. Please take up those opportunities to ensure that Omni continues to be the leading provider of gymnastics in Hawke's Bay.

### TREASURERS REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

The commentary on a year like this one is a bit challenging. The momentum we lost following 2020 COVID restrictions did take the gloss off what, in reflection, has been a good year for the club, all things considered. While the first three to four months didn't exactly get off to a flying start, the balance of the year helped to make up lost ground. The COVID shutdown for the last two weeks of August 2021 was a bitter pill as well. The daytime programme had been really humming and term three was shaping up to be our best yet.

Comparisons to the year ended August 2020 lose a bit of relevance so in the review of key numbers below the comparisons are made to the year ended August 2019, being the last full "normal" year.

### The numbers (compared to 2019)

Revenue was up by 16% and expenses also up by 7%

<u>Club Term fees</u> – 2021 was a few thousand dollars down on 2019 and reflected the slow start to the year recovering numbers after 2020 COVID restrictions. The rest of the year was up in comparison but not quite enough to claw ahead.

<u>School bookings</u> – the hard work by the team showed dividends this year with revenue in excess of double 2019. If we could only get an uninterrupted year, this part of our daytime programme is will become a good solid contributor to future expansion.

<u>Holiday Programmes</u> – The popularity of these continues to grow and was 70% up on 2019, this was despite fewer days offered in this year.

ACC Levies – increased due to higher staffing levels to support the growing activity.

<u>Cleaning costs</u> – reduced 50% as we have not reinstated the commercial cleaners post 2020 COVID shutdowns. This is being undertaken in house.

<u>Consulting</u> – some expenses are being incurred as part of our building expansion project. Unfortunately, a necessary evil.

<u>Depreciation</u> – a big jump here in relation to the equipment capital expenditure, mainly the new floor and tumble strip, among other things.

<u>GNZ Membership fees</u> – down a bit on the 2019 numbers for the same reason as the drop in Club Term Fees, they are interrelated.

<u>Insurance</u> – most insurers are increasing premiums and we were not immune but factors in a full year of the additional cover placed against new equipment and offsite equipment storage.

<u>Interest expense</u> – we continue to operate on a floating rate which is significantly cheaper than fixing it right now. Interest expense was less than half the 2020 year and a bit over a third of 2019. Great to see this coming down.

<u>Staff Professional development & training</u> – still being hampered by COVID with few opportunities for upskilling and training. While it is good not having to spend as much it does hold back staff development and opportunity to add value to the programmes.

<u>Uniform Costs</u> – larger expense here around the roll out of new competitive uniforms and track suits. This includes the new club logo.

<u>Wages & salaries</u> – the April minimum wage increase and reindexing salaried staff saw an expected increase. There are increased hours too, as the daytime programmes continue to grow. The COVID wage subsidy has been used in the last two weeks of August 2021 as well, due to the shutdown.

### **Capital expenditure**

Additions through the year included the Tumbling Strip (\$12k), New signage and branding (\$2k) and replacement beam covers (\$3.8k). Not quite the same level of spending as 2020 but this was all self-funded. We continually review capital expenditure to maintain the safety of gymnasts and improve their experiences.

We are very pleased to report the continued good financial health of the club, it is important so we can deliver a great experience for everyone who enjoys the facility and programmes. Thanks to the dedicated team that make this happen.

### **CENTRE MANAGER REPORT**

I would like to first acknowledge the committee, staff, volunteers, helpers, parents, kids and everyone who has been involved in the ongoing running of our fantastic club. Without all these important people doing their part, we just wouldn't have the club that we have.

A special thanks and mention must go to our departing President Jo Cox. Jo has given so much to the club and will be greatly missed.

We find ourselves navigating through a very different world. With COVID-19 continuing to be a big part of our lives, adapting to the circumstances is a must and patience a need. Working together and following the rules, we will get through this and be stronger for it.

While we haven't had the full year of activities, what we did manage to put on went well and was well attended.

Registrations are still strong, with us providing over 4600 hours of gymnastic sessions within the club, from Term 4 2020 to the end of Term 3 2021, even with a lockdown thrown in. On top of this we had over 5000 kids from local schools, early childhood centres, and disability groups participate over the same period, and this doesn't include the schools we delivered our programme directly to and our recreational classes.

While this is all fantastic news and great to see, the biggest issue we continue to face, (not including COVID) is space. Planning for expansion of the club is still underway and making progress. Hopefully, in the not too distant future, we will see this come to life in the form of a physical extension.

The last twelve months have been a very busy and a challenging time. It has not been easy to navigate the weekly changes due to COVID-19 and especially with the Delta variant in the community. It has seen us operate under restrictions that would not normally be a part of our regular daily routines. But as a team, all of you have stood up and got on with what we had to do.

### PROGRAMME COORDINATOR REPORT

This year would have been one of the successful years for us if COVID hadn't hit us. This year I have applied for two different grants for both the offsite and onsite programmes through Tu Manawa Active Aotearoa. They approved funding of just over \$22,000 for the offsite school programme and onsite disability programme.

Everything was running smoothly and then COVID hit us again and we were into lockdown for 4 weeks. During the lockdown, I delivered an online home fundamental gymnastics to keep motivating our recreational athletes. Each week they were working on different challenges. We saw great efforts by the athletes via Facebook posts & videos.

<u>After School/Recreational Programme</u>: This remains a popular service. Most of the classes filled fast especially 5-7 yrs girls and 8-9 yrs girls' groups. The biggest challenge for us is not having enough staff, meaning we had to cancel some of the classes. Growth in the WAG programme is another reason for reducing classes as the space clashes with the competitive groups.

<u>Daytime Programme</u>: Our daytime programme is growing and running successfully. Throughout the year, I have booked 17 Childcare Centres and 15 Schools that include onsite and offsite programmes. Lockdown periods will push the school delivery and disability out to the end of Term 2, 2022.

<u>Disability Programme</u>: Adding a disability programme to the daytime programme has always been my biggest aim. The disability community are loving the programme we are providing. We have 4 main schools - Hohepa School, Havelock North High School, Kowhai School, and Fairhaven School (Fairhaven school running 8 satellites in different locations) - who are attending the disability programme. Autism Hawke's Bay has also registered in July and October holiday programme. They

are all hugely satisfied with the programme. We had positive feedback from all the schools, they want to return next year as well.

<u>Birthday Parties</u>: Slowly and steadily this is becoming popular. We have booked 15 Birthday parties over the year. I am still getting lots of enquiries.

<u>Holiday Programme</u>: The Holiday Programme is the greatest success for us. The July holiday programme was a little disappointing, when we ran a one week holiday programme due to the shortage of staff. But we managed to run 7 different outside holiday programme groups during the second week. We are also running a holiday programme in December from 20<sup>th</sup> Dec to 24 Dec. Here are the details of the Holiday programme over the year.

We have received great feedback from them.

### **WAG Annual Report**

After a successful display before the AGM and a Pit, pools and Pizza day where the pit was emptied and checked, we finished 2020 with a break until January 11<sup>th</sup> 2021. This was the beginning of training for the Senior Competitive group.

The Junior Competitive groups began training on January 18<sup>th</sup>. This is always a great working period with just the competitive groups in the gym.

Individual interviews were conducted with all Senior gymnasts and parents for goal setting during the January period.

Two parent meetings were held on Wednesday February 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday February 12<sup>th</sup>. These opportunities were provided to clarify the 2021 competition schedule and the return to judging with start values and execution scores. The two meeting system worked well.

The Juniors found early season training stressful with the heat and other activities in the gym. This affected concentration levels when learning new routines.

Step 7 & 8 gymnasts began extra Sunday sessions to work more individually on their skills.

<u>Uniforms</u>: The design of our leotards, logo and tracksuits were all altered in readiness for the beginning of the competitive season. A massive task!

The gymnasts looked really smart at the first competition with the leotards sparkling. Unfortunately, after the first wash red dye ran into the white fabric giving a tie dye look. We returned to the 2020 leotards for the rest of the season and the damaged leotards were returned to the supplier.

We had excellent Junior results at the early competitions in HBPB and Palmerston north. Lea Shand Omni Step 1 won the HBPB Junior trophy. There were mixed results from the Seniors from their early competitions as they worked hard to qualify. Ormlie van Veldhuizen qualified at her first competition. Penelope Fowler also qualified early but unfortunately fractured her foot during warm up in Palmerston North.

<u>Tumble strip</u>: It was great when finally all parts of the extra floor arrived allowing for the tumble strip to be back operating. This greatly improved coaching and planning of our sessions.

<u>Departure</u>: Unfortunately, Karen Cooper and Nicole McLaren left the Step 1 coaching team at the end of Term 1. They gave many voluntary hours to the club which is appreciated. Grace Shearer, coach of our Junior Recreation Advanced class, has joined the team to help Lauren coach the Step 1's.

<u>Beam covers</u>: This was another eagerly awaited improvement to our programme. These were both replaced during the July holidays. They have improved confidence in all beam work. Next task is to recover both low beams.

<u>Nationals</u>: There was a very small contingent from Omni this year despite extra planning, training and commitment by coaches and parents. WAG gymnasts Amy Alexander and Ormlie van Veldhuizen represented HBPB. They had a really challenging time with an injury on the training day and an unexpected fall on bars which meant both missed qualifying for the second day of competition.

<u>Hosting</u>: Three very successful competitions have been hosted in Omni this year. The first of these was the boys' section of the HBPB junior competition. This had great numbers competing, all of whom enjoyed the competition and who are keen to return in 2022.

The second competition was the HBPB Open Championships for WAG. This was Omni's first time hosting this event. It was a great success. Thank you to all that helped to make this happen. Place

getters in Step 7 were Ashlee McMillan, Samantha Lawes and Sienna Manisty, and Lola Nicholls in Step 5. Both HBPB Senior trophies were awarded to Ormlie van Veldhuizen Step 8.

The third competition was our Omni Junior competition where the team results for Omni were outstanding. All steps performed to an exceptionally high standard. Well done coaches and gymnasts.

<u>Term 3 lockdown</u>: This was more difficult to plan for compared to 2020 as it was uncertain how long it was going to last. Once again we did a staged return once we reached level 2. The Seniors first, then Junior competitive before the Recreation classes were able to return for the last week of the term.

<u>Holiday breaks</u>: There are a number of these that fall in Term 1. During this year we found this really disruptive to a programme with early competitions. We will need to find a solution to this in 2022.

One last task: We had the next squad of new competitive gymnasts to select on Sunday October 17th.

A very sincere thank you to the team of WAG coaches. You have endured yet another year of obstacles, but throughout have ensured that your gymnasts have progressed and been very successful.

Our coaches have worked hard while the boys have been in the gym & equally hard to motivate & challenge them during lockdown. Numbers have remained steady in spite of all the disruption.

We are again indebted to our judges – Michelle, Xavier & Quinn Le Lievre, Kevina Ward & Tom Dew. They have once again gone above & beyond to ensure our boys are able to compete both here in Hawke's Bay & away from the region.

## Omni Gymnastic Centre Incorporated For the year ended 31 August 2021

#### 1. Reporting Entity

Omni Gymnastic Centre Incorporated is as an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

### 2. Accounting Policies

The accounting policies recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed.

The Omni Gynmastics Centre Incorporated qualifies for differenential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and it is not large as defined under the framework for differential reporting. The Society has taken advantage of all available exemptions.

#### 3. Income Tax:

Omni Gymnastic Centre Incorporated has an exemption from Income Tax as a non-profit sports club,. However, certain types of income are taxable and where applicable, tax is accounted for by the taxes payable method. It has a tax exemption under section DV8 of the Income Tax Act 2007 on the first \$1000 of taxable income.

#### 4. Goods and Services Tax

All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST

### 5. Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less aggregate depreciation.

#### 6. Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their net realisable value.

#### 7. Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated using rates permitted under the Income Tax Act 2007.

#### 8. Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in Accounting Policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those used in previous reporting period.

### 9. Contingent Liabilities

No known commitments or contingent liabilities are known to exist at balance date.

### 10. Related Party Transactions

There have been no material related party transactions during the financial year for which these financial statements are prepared.

### 11. Westpac Term Loan
